Back Drop – About A.D. 50

 Corinth was a great and powerful Greek City. It's about 45 miles from Athens and is situated on an isthmus (a narrow strip of land with sea on either side) that joins the mainland of Greece to the Peloponnesus (a large peninsula in southern Greece that juts into the Mediterranean Sea). It had a population of approximately 600,000 people. Greek merchants made it their home and, because it was an important center for commerce and transportation throughout the Mediterranean region, Jews were attracted to it for business purposes. It became infamous for vice and sexual indulgence and was home to a temple of Aphrodite. Aphrodite was the false god of sexual immorality, and the temple was a place to practice your sexual desires. Wickedness and idolatry was rampant, and drunkenness was common. Dishonesty was the expected thing. If you said a man behaved like a Corinthian, it was an insult.

Acts 18:1-4

¹After this, Paul left Athens and went to Corinth. ² There he met a Jew named Aquila, a native of Pontus, who had recently come from Italy with his wife Priscilla, because Claudius had ordered all Jews to leave Rome. Paul went to see them, ³ and because he was a tentmaker as they were, he stayed and worked with them. 4 Every Sabbath he reasoned in the synagogue, trying to persuade Jews and Greeks.



Acts 18:1-4

Facts about Paul:

- Paul left Athens and arrived in Corinth.
- 2. Paul met Aquila (husband).
- 3. Paul went to see them (Aquila & Priscilla).
- 4. Paul was a tentmaker, like them.
- 5. Paul worked and stayed with them.
- 6. Paul went to the synagogue every Sabbath.

¹⁸ Paul stayed on in Corinth for some time. Then he left the brothers and sisters and sailed for Syria, accompanied by Priscilla and Aquila. Before he sailed, he had his hair cut off at Cenchreae because of a vow he had taken. 19 They arrived at Ephesus, where Paul left Priscilla and Aquila. He himself went into the synagogue and reasoned with the Jews. 20 When they asked him to spend more time with them, he declined. 21 But as he left, he promised, "I will come back if it is God's will." Then he set sail from Ephesus. ²² When he landed at Caesarea, he went up to Jerusalem and greeted the church and then went down to Antioch.



Hebrew and Greek

Hebrew word — sh'mah — meaning "listen to the voice of"

Greek word – hupakoe (pronounced hoop-ak-o-ay) – meaning "attentive hearkening"


Hebrew/Greek

Hupotasso –

It was originally a military term formed from two Greek words that mean "to arrange under". When a company of troops would hupotasso, they would arrange themselves in formation under the leadership of their commander.


Most of the time, however, hupotasso appears in the middle or passive voice. This describes a voluntary choice to submit to someone with higher power of authority.

We are instructed by God to "submit to your own husbands as you do to the Lord"!



Hear Me Out Before You Shut Me Out!






